The Wondrous Cross

"When I survey the wondrous cross, on which the prince of glory died, my richest gain I count but loss, and pour contempt on all my pride" When I Survey the Wondrous Cross, vs. 1

I have always read the words of this hymn as noting any cross as wondrous. At St. Mark's, I have found a cross that is wondrous in and of itself. When I sit in the front row of the pews and look up at the cross above the altar, I see a four-sided cross with the rugged metal inserts. I have never seen a four-sided cross before, and yet it fits so well in this sanctuary because the pews surround the altar and the cross on three sides. It is truly a cross that inspires wonder and deeper thought and contemplation.

Lutherans are not ashamed of the cross. We don't hide it or pretend it isn't part of our faith.

And pondering the meaning of the cross is a central purpose of Lent. Jesus died upon the cross. This very thought should cause us to shudder every time we think about it. The cross was an instrument of torture used by the Roman Empire which ruled the Judea where Jesus lived.

The cross means suffering.

The cross means blood spilled out.

The cross means a publicly humiliating death.

The empty cross, for us, tells us that Jesus is risen from the dead.

We go on this Lenten journey every year. We go through this time of looking at the cross with wonder, and pondering what it means for our lives, so when we get to Good Friday with Jesus on the cross, and then to celebrating his resurrection from the dead on Easter, we understand the triumph over suffering and death in a more

What does the cross mean for us? It means that the value of our lives is found, not in what we can gather or gain on our own, but in the cross, where Jesus gave his life for us.



HVAC - First Choice Heating serviced all three boilers on January 5. All three were in good shape. The oldest boiler's auto-fill, and temperature control module, weren't working, but both were repairable.

The blower motor in the front entry heater is not working again. There is some heat coming thru the radiator, but no blowing. Parts are no longer available. First Choice is looking into other available options.

I remember sitting in the hospital room with our young adult son years ago. He was recovering from emergency surgery due to a ruptured spleen. I remember not being able to pray. It was a strange feeling for someone who likes to talk to God. I wasn't mad at God, but I think I was so overwhelmed by the situation that I couldn't form the words that I wanted to say to God.



That's when the calls and texts started to come in. I couldn't pray, but I discovered that God was moving others to pray for us. What a beautiful gift to be wrapped in the prayers of others!

Mortgage Summary

St. Mark's mortgage matured in mid-January and we now have a renewed 3-year business loan from the Waukesha State Bank with an amortization length of 13.5 years. We did some shopping around for the lowest possible interest rate and the 6.94% rate was the best we could find. Hopefully in 3 years we will enjoy lower interest rates.

Below are some facts about the new mortgage:

A note from our treasurer:

St. Mark's recently renewed our mortgage with Waukesha State Bank. The terms proposed were for 5 years at a 7.97% rate. As most of you may know interest rates have gone up considerably in the last few years. Our previous rate was 3.47%. After several negotiations with WSB, Frank Remfrey was able to get the rate reduced to 6.94% for three years. The loan amount is \$155,040. The monthly payment will increase \$293 per month. This will add \$3,516 in expenses to our budget that was approved in December.

Our Lenten Journey

Lent invites us to slow down for 40 days to reflect, turn to God, and pray. The season prepares us to observe and appreciate the gift of Jesus' death and resurrection for us. You are invited to these opportunities to draw near to God during this season:

Midweek Lenten Prayer Services are on Wednesdays (February 21st-March 20th) at Noon in-person and live stream on Facebook and YouTube. Our theme for these services will explore the meaning of the Lord's Prayer and help us experience peace through the pathway of prayer. Deacon Marcia and the "Still Waters Run Deep" discipleship huddle will lead these services.

A Special Lenten Offering for ELCA World Hunger. More than 820 million people—that's about 11 percent of people in our world today—are hungry. An animal can make a world of difference for a family in need. Animals provide food to eat, fertilizer to grow crops and offspring to sell at the market. We hope to gather \$715 to purchase a family farm (a cow, two pigs, a couple of goats, a dozen chicks, farming tools, seeds, and agricultural training) that creates a world of opportunity for a family living in poverty. Maybe we can contribute enough to purchase two or three farms. Checks may be made payable to St Mark's Lutheran Church with "Lenten special offering" on the memo line. More than 85 percent of our contributions will directly support the program; less than 15 percent is used for administration and fundraising by ELCA World Hunger.



Something New! Daily Prayer Prompts. Take 60 seconds a day to pray for someone else. We'll be praying for someone different each day (like people you know who are experiencing depression and anxiety, people who care for those with dementia and Alzheimer's, or people who care for the earth). We'll provide a new prayer prompt each day on Facebook and in the email blast and bulletin announcements as we lift up others to God.

Looking for a Way to Serve Others?

We have a few opportunities and invite you to pray about it. Contact Marcia Marquardt for more information.

Communion Visitor who brings care, conversation, devotional, and Communion about **once a month** to someone who can't come to worship in-person. This ministry is a beautiful way to connect with a person who might be isolated and offer God's love. Marcia will guide and train you.

Office Helper who prints the bulletin, posts it on our website, and checks the answering machine **once a month**. It will likely take you about 2-3 hours to do this work. Debbie Wagner will remain our principal volunteer in the church office this year, but we are hoping to add two helpers to assist her. This important ministry equips us to worship God by printing and posting the bulletin. Debbie will guide and train you.

Food Pantry Delivery Person who delivers the donated food to Salvation Army and Waukesha Food Pantry when needed **(usually about once a month)** and invites donations to this ministry in the Lookout newsletter. Our food donations are located in the basket near the elevator on the main level. This loving ministry helps St. Mark's go into the community to feed hungry people. Mavis McGrath will guide and train you.

St. Mark's Quilters

Last month, the Quilters were blessed with a donation of several rolls of batting from Chris and Vonda Bicket. They knew that St. Mark's Quilters would make good use of the extra batting. This is a wonderful gift because batting is a large expense when making the quilts.

Seventeen quilts were recently donated to children and expectant mothers who are patients at the Community Smiles Dental Clinic. Several quilts were donated to Three Pillars in Dousman for their annual fundraiser for Their Memory Care Initiative. Large and small quilts were donated to Summit Woods for a fundraiser to help Habitat for Humanity in their efforts to build a new neighborhood of affordable homes in Waukesha.


Blessings Box. Fresh food spoils quickly and attracts critters.
