#### **Cheerfulness in Serving**

Thank you for the warm welcome to St. Mark's Lutheran Church. I found everyone unfailingly cheerful, warm and concerned that I feel comfortable here.

St. Mark's is a vital, life-filled, spirit-filled church.

I am blessed to be your pastor for this season in the life of St. Mark's. A season of transition, while you are in discernment to prepare you to call a new pastor for a settled call. The synod refers to me as a "Pastor Accompanying a Congregation in Transition" (a PACT). I find this title very accurate. We are on the journey from what was to what will be together.

I have served congregations as a settled pastor, and I have served seven congregations as a transition pastor.

What sets St. Mark's apart is your cheerfulness in serving and your focus on discipleship. So many of you have welcomed me with warmth and concern for my comfort. 

#### From Deacon Marcia Marquardt

Dear St. Mark's Family and Friends,

It was the early months of the Pandemic when my husband and I decided to try a new route for our evening walk. We were still adjusting to the isolation and challenge of this season—wondering what the future had in store. A new route seemed like a pleasant change. That's when I spotted her. A girl, about 10 or 11 years old, hanging out on her driveway near her home. It's easy to be distracted or discouraged and miss noticing what God is doing. We might feel alone or frustrated. But God invites us to remember what he has done in the past and then move forward keeping an eye out for what he is doing today, tomorrow, and in the time to come. Just like I kept my eye open for the cheery girl in my neighborhood, God invites us to be on the lookout for him as we walk along in this journey of life.

I wonder what you are facing right now in your personal life. We continue forward as a congregation in this time of transition. We are grateful for God's gift of Pastor Sara's leadership in this time. Through it all, God is there—offering himself to us every step of our journey inviting us to watch and stay alert for his presence and work among us.

God, keep our eyes and hearts open to see you among, within, and around us. Amen.

#### Financial Summary for First Quarter (Jan. Feb, March) of 2023

The first 3 months of 2023 ended with St. Mark's having a total income of \$67,070.52 year-to-date. The current budget calls for \$70,000.03 at this point. Our expenses as of March 31st total \$39,071, far below our budgeted amount of \$70,826 for the first quarter. The expenses will rise back to a more normal rate now that we have Pastor Sara on board as our Interim Pastor. Pastor Sara will be compensated at the same rate listed in the 2023 budget for Pastor salary and benefits.

The net income for the first quarter is \$27,999 compared to the budgeted amount \$53.53. The net income does not reflect the approximate \$733 per month in principal payments on the mortgage.

- The three Boilers had their annual tune-ups on March 1st. The newest boiler (2018) had a faulty pump that was replaced at no charge. The oldest boiler (1983) has a slight knocking noise. It was adjusted, but it could indicate future problems.
- Church
- **Carpets** were cleaned in the pastoral office, in Marcia's office, in the secretarial office, and in the Chapel. All the upholstered furniture in the pastoral office was cleaned, too, and it looks like new!
- A desk for the pastoral office was donated by Anne & Al Link. Thanks to Bob & Mary Johnson, and Jeremy Bjerke for getting it to church.
- The **Fire Inspection** was done on March 23 NO Violations.
- Windows in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall were professionally cleaned prior to Easter.
- Members of the Property Team have solicited multiple quotes for the **removal of a damaged tree and debris** below the parking lot, that were the result of a storm last fall. A vendor has been selected and they will remove the tree and debris within the month.
- Thanks to the gardeners & others (Sharon C., Mary & Bob J., Mary Jo C., Angela Z., Sue & Ann, Donna & Terry I.) for raking leaves out of the beds and adding new mulch, and for cleaning up the grounds around the church and parking lot. Thank you to Bob J. for refinishing the outdoor bench near the lower entrance.
- The **wooden cross** from over the original 1952 church altar has been hung in the Chapel in preparation for our 75th Anniversary celebration.

St. Mark's Quilters have been sharing their gifts with many organizations in our community. Last month quilts were delivered to Homeless Veterans Initiative and Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center. Two of the organizations featured in our Lenten Special Offering also received quilts. We donated lap quilts to Tricia's Troops. They make Chemo Care Packages to share much-needed comfort and relief to individuals beginning chemotherapy treatment. We also shared 10 children's quilts with the Community Smiles Dental Clinic for their Expectant Mother's Program. Twelve men and women's quilts were delivered to the Aspen Center and twelve women and children's quilts went to Bethany Recovery Center in Oconomowoc. Quilt gift baskets were made to help raise funds for Healing Hearts, Community Dental Smiles Clinic and a local fundraiser for a single mom who is fighting Cancer.




#### **Sanctuary Flowers**
